CONGRESSMAN KEVIN KILEY • Proudly serves the people of California's 3rd District in the House of Representatives in his first term in office. Kiley also serves on the Education and the Workforce Committee and is Chair of the Subcommittee on Workforce Protections, as well as a member of the Subcommittee on Early Childhood, Elementary, and Secondary Education.
